Backing up

Don't restore the /etc folder

Music CDs - Playing, Ripping and Burning

Using *sound-juicer* application

Sound-juicer extracts (rips) to .ogg format

To rip to MP3 format, install:

`gstream0.10-plugins-ugly-multiverse`

Start sound-juicer

Configure sound-juicer

Edit -> preferences -> Edit Profiles ...

Select - CD Quality, MP3

Insert the CD into the drive

Select the track(s) to be ripped

Click on Extract

Extracted files save in home directory

To create an audio CD use *serpentine*

Serpentine seems to recognize .ogg files not MP3s

Networking

Using the /etc/hosts file (`C:\WINNT\System32\drivers\etc\hosts`)

VirtualBox

- The best way is to add VirtualBox to the list of repositories and let Ubuntu install VB.
- Get the repository name from the [virtualbox.org web site](http://virtualbox.org/wiki/Downloads)
- Go to: <http://virtualbox.org/wiki/Downloads>
- To install VB on Ubuntu 7.04 (Feisty Fawn) copy the line:
 - deb <http://www.virtualbox.org/debian> feisty non-free
- Start the Ubuntu *Synaptec Package Manager*
- Click on Settings -> Repositories
- Select the *Third-Party Software* tab
 - Click on the "+ Add" button
 - Paste the deb string into the *APT line*
 - Close the repositories dialog
- Select *Search* from the Package Manager
 - Enter virtualbox (one word)
- Mark for upgrade
- Click on *Apply*
- To start VB
- Click on Nautilus
- Navigate to /opt/VirtualBox-1.4.0 and double-click *VirtualBox*
- Follow the prompts

After creating the virtual machine select the *CD-ROM* as the boot device

After the OS is installed, change the boot device to *Hard Disk*

Put a launcher for VB on the desktop or Panel
