Security

- Past security concerns were with computer viruses
 - Virus writers were interested, primarily, in causing inconvenience to as many as possible
 - Bragging rights within the hacker community
 - Macs were relatively safe
 - Macs are fewer in number than PCs (security by obscurity)
 - Also, Macs are inherently more secure
- Today virus writers are money motivated
 - Domestic and international organized-crime organizations are involved
 - Employing skilled computer programmers (many out-of-work)
 - Goals are; identity theft, access to credit-card information, and financial account information
 - Social engineering; getting people to give up information
 - Example: calling the help desk at large company and posing as an employee who lost their password
 - On the web, phishing is commonly used
- Example email from Bank of America
- Always be vigilant
- Think twice before providing personal information
- Be wary of requests to download files, viewers and unknown updates
