### How to Keep Windows XP And Still be (Somewhat) Safe

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# Buy a New Computer

- Most new computers come with Windows 8, it is quite different.
  - Desktops Cost \$400-\$600
  - Laptops Cost \$300-\$600
  - Come to the HW Sig on Tuesday and we can make it look more like the XP you are used to
- Consider a Chromebook
  - Chromebooks cost between \$200-\$300, depending on screen size and speed.

## Install A New Operating System

- Install Windows 7 or 8Costs over \$100
  - High Probability that it will not work on older computer.
    - Existing peripherals may not work with Windows 7 or 8
    - Use <u>http://go.microsoft.com/fwlink/p/?LinkId=321548</u> to check for compatability
  - Come to the HW Sig on Tuesday and we can make Win 8 look more like the XP you are used to
- Install Linux Mint
  - Although the desktop looks .

## Keep your existing XP System

- The following suggestions are presented in order of importance
  - Become a *limited user*
  - Use a different Browser
  - Use a recommended Anti-virus software
  - Switch to a different office suite
  - Use recommended Browser Add-ons/extensions
  - Use Webmail

# Be a "Limited" User

- 90% of the Malware over the last several years could NOT have infected your computer it you were not an Admin user
- Almost 100% of the Malware over the last year could NOT have infected your computer it you were not an Admin user
  - Creating a separate Admin account is easy
  - Running as an limited user is a pain ....

## How to be a "Limited" User -1

- Go to the Start Menu
  - Open the Control Panel
  - Select the "User Accounts" Icon
- Click "Create a New Account"
  - Under "Related Tasks"
  - Give the New account a Name
    - Click Next
    - Set the Account type to "Administrator"
      - Click "Create Account"
- Close open windows

## How to be a "Limited" User -2

- Go to the Start Menu
  - Open the Control Panel
  - Select the "User Accounts" Icon
  - Select "Change Account"
    - Select Your Account
    - Select "Change My Account Type"
      - Select "Limited"
      - Click "Change Account Type"
- Close open windows

## How to be a "Limited" User -3

- Your account is no longer an administrator account
- You now have a new account you can use when you need to install software or install updates
- Use **your** account for everything else

#### Not use Internet Explorer?

- IE (on Win XP) will not be updated by Microsoft
- Several other browsers will continue to be updated
  - They can import your IE settings
  - They can run extensions that will protect you even further
    - Web of Trust (Protects you against malicious sites)
    - No Script/ScriptNo (Protects you against pop-aps adware)

  - If you want, you can change it to default to Microsoft Office formats
