- Moderate year for facility updates
 - New Win 7 HP Desktop for classroom (AMD Phenom II quad-core w 8GB of RAM, 1TB hard drive)
 - Reconfigured classroom desk to provide both a PC and an iMac for presenters.
 - Projector repairs & lamps
 - Friday maintenance sessions to keep PCs up to date
 - Replaced the 2 sign-in PCs with Compaq desktops.
 - 12 new wide-screen monitors for student PCs in lab.
