# Looking Back at 2016 Facilities

### April Burglary:

- Thieves broke in and stole 8 laptops + 3 iMacs
- Total loss \$11,000 insurance reimbursed \$5000
- Took 3½ months to recover and reopen lab
- Now have Lexan-reinforced windows & doors
- Now have motion-sensing burglar alarm system

#### In the Lab:

- 8 new HP Pavilion laptops were purchased and deployed
- 2 refurbished iMac PCs were purchased and deployed

### In the Classroom:

- 1 refurbished iMac PCs was purchased and deployed
- Bought an Apple TV unit to facilitate projecting from iPhones
