Basic Web Site Concepts



- A website's content resides on a web *server*.
- The website is accessed via a web *browser* and has a unique IP address and URL.
- A web *site* contains one or more web *pages*.
- Web pages contain various *elements*:
 - Formatted text
 - Tables
 - Images (hyperlinks)
 - Links to other pages (page hyperlinks)
 - Sounds (file hyperlinks)
 - Videos (file hyperlinks and script code Flash, h.264)
 - Web forms (fill-in fields, Submit button)
- Web page description language is Hyper Text Markup Language (HTML)
 - Most web editing tools generate HTML automatically.
 - HTML v5 is standard, HTML v4 still widely used.

- Social Media Sites (Highly structured, but offer a web presence)
 - Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest, Tik-tok, Snapchat, Reddit, X(Twitter), YouTube, Linked In
- Common features:
 - Includes web-based authoring tools (usually drag & drop, WYSIWYG).
 - Often has nice pre-built templates, themes and widgets to add professional effects without coding.
 - Extensive support for e-commerce: storefronts, payments (usually in paid tiers).
 - Generally, will have ads sprinkled around the edges of your free site. (You can buy a premium plan to eliminate the ads, add more features, storage.)
 - Default URL goes to the hosting service with your account name pre-pended or appended. (You can register a domain name and link it to your account).

Google Sites Free Hosting Service

- Let's Create a Google Sites Website: "The Solo Gourmet"
 - Open the Template Gallery and review the available templates.
 - Choose a template or "blank site" we'll choose the "Class" template.
 - Google will spin for a minute and then your new website's home page will appear.
 - The website's URL will be: <u>https://sites.google.com/view/thesologourmet/home</u>
- Now we can begin using the various Google Sites tools and web elements to build out our site.
 - Choose a Theme to set the default colors, fonts, styles.
 - Choose a background image for the banner (this appears on each page at the top)
 - Go to the Pages section (right hand pane) and begin adding named pages and sub-pages. This sets up the structure of the website and also populates the menu bar.
- Once the website is laid out you can begin working on the content of the various pages.
 - From the menu bar, select any page and it will open in the web page editor.

Editing Your Website (1)

- My website "The Solo Gourmet" has already some pages filled in.
- Let's add another Evening Meals recipe page
 - In the Pages tab to the right click the Evening Meal Recipes page.
 - Next click the "+" icon and choose "Create sub-page. (or Click the 3-dot menu of an existing recipe page and then click "Duplicate page".)
 - Name the new page.
 - If you accidentally got the positioning wrong, you can drag the new page onto its parent page.
 - The page editor will now open up with the page's name as the title in the banner. Edit this to suit.
- Let's add a Text Box with the Ingredients
 - Let's type in some text and format it with bullets.
 - Let's resize that text box to fit about 40% of the screen.
- Now let's duplicate that Text Box and drag it to be to the right of the Ingredients text box.
 - Let's type in the directions to make the dish.
 - Let's format the directions with numbers.
- When things look good, let's Preview the page.
- Finally, let's Publish the page to make it a visible part of the website.

Adding a Link to Your Home Page

- Let's add a Hyperlink from the Home page to our "Chile Verde" recipe with the caption: "Recipe of the Month"
 - In the Menu Bar or the Pages tab, click on the Home page to display it in the editor.
- Let's type in a Title line: "Recipe of the Month", select the line and click the Bold icon. Let's also click the "A" and change the text color to gold.
- Next, in the Pages tab, let's hover over the desired recipe page, click the 3-dots menu and choose Properties. Let's press Ctrl+A to select the name of the desired page and then Ctrl+C to copy it to the clipboard.
- On the Home page, let's now place the cursor and press Ctrl+V to paste in the page name: "Pork Chile Verde Soft Taco". Let's drag to select that string.
- Next, let's click the chain link icon which creates a link. A popup will appear with a slot for the page name (or other URL) to which the link connects. Click in the slot and press Ctrl+V to paste in the page name as the link target.
- When things look good, let's Preview the page and click on the new link to make sure it works.
- Finally, let's Publish the page to make it a visible part of the website.

Adjusting Your Website's Settings

• Click the gear icon ("Settings") to display the Settings dialog. Let's explore ...

User Experience (UX) Guidelines (1)

- Watch out for color conflicts.
 - Keep backgrounds light.
 - Keep text dark need good contrast.
 - Avoid red on green ABC or blue on yellow ABC (color blind users)
- Test your site at various screen resolutions.
- Avoid Font-o-Mania.
 - Favor Sans-Serif fonts (Arial, Verdana, Tahoma).
 - Avoid **FONTS** that aren't broadly available (won't render correctly on most users' PCs)
 - Use images for elaborate fonts or logos.
 - MS Word's Word Art can create neat special effects.
 - New CSS3 standard offers many interesting effects.

User Experience (UX) Guidelines (2)

- Keep total page download times < 30 seconds (dial up)
 - Watch image file sizes (big images download slowly)
 - Watch PDF file sizes (if large, indicate the size)
- Resist "Way Cool" Mania (distracting)
 - Animated images
 - Scrolling marquees
 - Pop-ups
- Keep your Home Page "G" Rated
 - If you have pages with "adult" material, best to include a warning next to any links to those pages.
- Links to large file downloads, videos or audio files should show size or length
 - User may want to wait and download overnight
